

Did you know?

- The pipes you see coming out of the ground at the closed area of the Tomoka Landfill are methane wells. The methane gas collected from the closed landfill is converted into electricity at a generation plant. The wells generate enough electricity to power 3,800 Volusia County homes.



- One gallon of motor oil, carelessly disposed, can contaminate one million gallons of drinking water. Never put oil in your garbage or pour it into the ground or drainage lines. Many Volusia County fire stations and the Household Hazardous Waste Centers at the Tomoka Landfill and West Volusia Transfer Station accept used motor oil.
- Retail outlets that supply automobile batteries also will accept your old one for recycling. Some recycling buyback centers will buy your used batteries. The Household Hazardous Waste Center also accepts them. Call (386) 943-4905 for a brochure about buyback centers.

Electronic recycling

Residents may drop off obsolete electronics (computers, monitors, printers, televisions, etc.) at the Household Hazardous Waste Centers at the Tomoka Landfill and West Volusia Transfer Station.

Garbage disposal

(Typically household waste)

The county's Recycling and Solid Waste Division is operated as an enterprise system in which users pay for the operation of disposal activities. The garbage disposal rate is \$34 per ton, one of the lowest rates in Florida.

Construction/demolition debris

Fencing, floor tiles, lumber, wallboard, etc., are not accepted curbside and must be brought to the landfill, transfer station or private landfills in Volusia County. For disposal fees and locations, call (386) 943-7889.

Paint exchange

Residents can trade used paint for new colors at the Paint Exchange, a service provided by Volusia County's Recycling and Solid Waste Division. Please call the Tomoka Landfill at (386) 947-2952 to make arrangements.



Woody waste recycling

The Volusia County Recycling and Solid Waste Division recycles yard waste, land clearing debris and clean wood into reusable mulch products at the Tomoka Landfill and West Volusia Transfer Station. The mulch is available to residents year-round. To check availability, please call (386) 943-4905.

Appliances (white goods)

Landfill disposal of appliances/white goods is banned by Florida law. Unincorporated residents must call their hauler to schedule a pickup for recycling. You also may ask local charities or appliance dealers if they would like to reuse them.

Tires

Whole tires are banned from landfill burial by Florida law. Residents may bring up to four automobile-size tires to the landfill or transfer station for free recycling on weekends only. A small fee is charged on weekdays. Oversize or off-road tires require a processing fee, and may be disposed of only at the Tomoka Landfill.

Residential curbside collection services

Please place waste or recycling bins within 10 feet of the curb by 6 a.m. on your pickup morning. Pickup could be anytime between 6 a.m. - 8 p.m. Construction/demolition debris, household hazardous waste and other toxic materials are not accepted curbside. Please refer to the Household Hazardous Waste brochure.



Garbage

- Garbage pickup is once a week in the proper container provided by the county's contracted garbage company.
- If the cart is full, you may place excess refuse in a 32-gallon container next to the cart.

Recycling

- The following materials may be recycled with the weekly collection:
 - **Mixed paper** – newspapers and inserts, phone books, corrugated cardboard, cereal boxes without liners, snack and drink boxes, junk mail, magazines, and mixed residential paper.
 - **Containers** – aluminum and steel cans, glass bottles (clear, green and amber), and plastic containers coded 1-7.



- Please flatten or fold large cardboard boxes to a 4' x 4' size. Do not bundle or tie the boxes.
 - Please rinse containers thoroughly if they have held toxic or contaminated materials.
 - No plastic bags or Styrofoam, please!
- Yard waste** – (includes grass, leaves, shrub and tree trimmings)
- Up to four 32-gallon containers (or the equivalent) may be placed by the curb each week, not to exceed eight cubic yards in a four-week period.
 - Use your old garbage containers for yard waste and eliminate the need for plastic bags.
 - Palm fronds and limbs need to be neatly stacked (no need to bundle). Limbs may not exceed four feet in length or one foot in diameter and must weigh less than 60 pounds.
