C. BARBERVILLE PIONEER SETTLEMENT.......10:30 – 11:30

Discover Yesterday Today! The Barberville Pioneer Settlement is a historical village nestled within a charming, moss-draped oak hammock on 30 acres. The Settlement features three of Volusia County's most unique historical buildings; the oldest brick residence in Volusia - The Joseph Underhill House, circa 1879, which is undergoing stabilization and restoration, The Barberville Central High School, circa 1919 which is listed on the National Register of Historical Places and the Astor Bridge Tender's House, circa 1926, which was saved from demise and moved to the Settlement in 1980. Along with 15 other historical structures and thousands of artifacts illustrating life in rural Florida in the bygone days of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Self-guided tours are available during regular business hours and guided tours by reservation only. Located on County Road 3, just west of the intersection of Hwy.17 & S.R. 40 in Barberville.

B. PAULINE'S LUCKY MARKET GARDEN......11:45- 12:30

Come visit a small commercial farm with organic practices and see heirloom vegetables being grown from seed to harvest. Learn about the beneficial and practical use of composting, green manure, cover crops, drip irrigation and frost protection. From Hwy. 17, head west on Rte. 40 for one half mile, turn left onto Lemmon Rd. then right into the first driveway at 299. paulinesluckymarketgarden.blogspot.com/

D. VO-LaSALLE FARMS......1:00 – 2:00

The Crump family, owners of Vo-LaSalle Farms, an active citrus operation, will discuss the latest citrus varieties, hydroponic strawberries and cutting edge irrigation techniques. Fresh picked fruit and vegetables will be available for sale. Go south on Lake Winona Rd. 3.5 miles, left onto Johnson Lake Rd. Off U.S. 17, go east on Lake Winona Rd., turn right on Johnson Lake Road, and go to 601. giftfruitfromflorida.com

E. EFG ORCHIDS2:30 – 3:30

Established in Addison, Illinois in 1939, this fourth generation nursery relocated to DeLand. They specialize in ground orchids. Take advantage of this unique opportunity to buy orchids directly from the wholesaler. Turn left onto FL-11 S, take the first left onto Daugharty Rd. take the second right onto Marsh Rd. OR from US 92, go north on Marsh Rd., 4.5 miles to 4265. efgorchids.com

F. TIGER BAY STATE FOREST......9:00 – 10:00

Tiger Bay State Forest, is one of two state forests in the Volusia County area, and a vital link in the Central Florida conservation lands and wildlife corridor. The Florida Forest Service manages state forests for multiple-use benefits including timber, wildlife, and recreational opportunities. Other Forest Service activities and services - firefighting and tree planting equipment, Firewise landscaping, Smokey Bear, tree seedlings, Forester demo's, and other activities will also be featured. The entrance is located at 4316 West International Speedway Boulevard in Daytona Beach.

Beeman's Nursery has been in operation since 2000. Steve Beeman and his son Forest, started Beeman's Nursery in an effort to supply native grasses and aquatic plants to a growing number of installation companies working for the state, golf courses and road side projects. The nursery is a wholesale only operation, but works with the local retailers to provide them with a good source of Natives. .After working on a patent for their "Floating Island System" they branched out and created a company around it. Beemats are floating islands of living plants, used to remove excess nutrients from water. They are located at 3637 SR 44 New Smyrna Beach, FL on SR44 .3.5 miles west of I95 and 1.5 miles East of SR415. beemansnursery.com
