ABOUT LAKE MONROE PARK



Overlooking the fabled St. Johns River as it flows into the waters of Lake Monroe, Lake Monroe Park and Campground offers a spectacular view of nature in its most pristine form.

Accessible by two boat ramps, the scenic river offers a wealth of recreational opportunities for the outdoor enthusiast. Twenty-five campsites, available with water and electric hookups, are nestled within a shady hammock of oaks and slash pines. Two group and three family-size pavilions and a children's playground provide an ideal place for social gatherings. A variety of bass, speckled perch, bluegills and catfish can be caught off the fishing pier.

WELCOME!

To retain the natural beauty of the park, the number of posted rules and regulations signs has been reduced. Please follow the rules listed below. Your cooperation will assist in protecting and maintaining the park. Thank you.

- The park is open from sunrise to sunset, unless otherwise posted. The entry gate closes approximately 30 minutes before sunset.
- Please refrain from using profanity or other destructive behavior.
- Glass containers are not permitted.
- · All camping must be on campsites.
- Firecrackers, explosives and weapons are not permitted.
- Fires are permitted in designated fire rings at campsites.
- Please deposit all refuse in litter receptacles throughout the park. Separate recycling receptacles are available for your convenience.
- Pets must be leashed at all times and are not to be left unattended. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their animals (County Code Chapter 14). Animal waste bags are available. Proof of rabies vaccination is required (tag).
 Pets are not permitted in the water or within 50 feet of the shoreline.
- The speed limit within the park is 10 mph.
- Please do not remove plants, feed the animals or disturb the wildlife.
- Parents must supervise their children at all times.
- Jumping, diving and climbing are prohibited on the boardwalks and fishing piers.
- Fishing is allowed in designated areas. A valid Florida freshwater fishing license is required.
- All fishing debris must be disposed of properly.
- All campsite visitors must leave when the park closes or pay an extra person fee.

From the east

Head west on I-4, take exit 104 (U.S. 17-92.) Turn north (left) on U.S. 17-92. The park is on the right.

From the west

Head east on I-4 and take exit 104. At the end of the ramp, turn left on U.S. 17-92. The park is on the right, just past the St. Johns River Bridge.


