WHEREAS, in 1995, she became the first African-American elected to the Deltona City Commission, went on to become vice mayor, and was re-elected three times; and

WHEREAS, she established programs to recognize Dr. Martin Luther King's birthday and is a member of many significant community organizations in west Volusia County; and
