ON-SITE PROGRAMS

This 360-acre preserve is home to native plants and abundant wildlife, including the Florida scrub jay and gopher tortoise. Wear closed-toe shoes, bring drinking water, and be prepared to hike on sugar sand trails.

SEINE NETTING & ESTUARINE STUDY

Grades 4-10

OUTDOOR: Estuaries provide vital nesting and feeding habitats for many aquatic plants and animals. Learn about various species that depend on them as we explore mangroves and collect aquatic species that live here.

WRACK IT UP

OUTDOOR: The wrack line feeds hungry shore birds, forms new dunes, and provides cover for wildlife, among other things! We'll be discussing the importance of beach wrack and learning about erosion, coastal armoring and beach raking. Test your observation skills while looking for clues in a fun beach scavenger hunt. We'll leave the area better than we found it by doing a beach cleanup.
