Lois Bollenback, the former General Manager of Votran, gave the staff report. It included an overhead PowerPoint slide presentation. Council discussion followed. Concerns were expressed about losing revenue from bus bench advertising. Ms. Bollenback said during the previous year, only a little more than \$1,000 had come in from that revenue stream. She explained various issues with the bench advertising program in the unincorporated areas of the County. Many of the cities had turned toward setting their own bench advertising policies, where in the past they traditionally had not had any at all. She further explained about the cost to transition the program to one of non-advertising. She concluded by stating it was staff's desire that the Council give direction on the public transit amenities program in general and also on advertising on bus benches within the unincorporated County.

Public participation followed. Ramara Garrett, with Waverly Media, the only current, private bench provider in the County, distributed and spoke about a report on her firm's points of objection to the streetside amenities program. She felt there should be some way for the County to partner with her firm for the public's benefit. **Douglas Kosarek**, representing the Volusia Tax Reform Executive Committee, also was opposed to the program. He encouraged the Council to leverage its money and deny or alter the proposal.

Additional Council discussion ensued. Concerns were stated about spending County revenue when advertising companies already were paying for the use of the benches as a marketing tool. County Attorney Dan Eckert pointed out either the County's longstanding bench advertising policy needed to be in compliance with its own Zoning Ordinance or else the Ordinance had to be reworked so the County could follow its own regulations. County Manager Jim Dinneen suggested ideas for enabling the system to grow by answering the needs of its users. Concerns were made about the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) being included in the process.

More discussion followed. Concerns were expressed over losing the federal funding if it were not used right away. Ms. Bollenback and Ken Fischer, Interim General Manager of Votran, explained there were some time constraints, but the County would be safe from that for more than a year. Other discussion followed about various amenities and ways to develop them in different areas.

Council Member Northey said she felt the proposal was an opportunity to improve the community, develop a positive image and facilitate access for seniors and the disabled. She moved for APPROVAL of the program. Council Member Alexander seconded the motion. Some discussion on the motion followed. Chair Bruno called for an electronic vote and the motion FAILED 2-5, with Council Members Northey and Alexander in support and Council Members Hayman, Kelly, Persis, Wagner and Chair Bruno in opposition.

Chair Bruno said if the County was going to continue to have bench advertising, there would have to be a change in the sign ordinance. He said he would like a motion to direct staff to return to the Council with a change in the sign ordinance that would allow bus bench advertising. Mr. Eckert CLARIFIED the motion to be an amendment to the sign ordinance to allow the advertising and thereafter a revisiting of the procurement process for selection of an advertising firm.

Council Member Hayman so moved and Council Member Wagner seconded the motion. Further discussion ensued. Mr. Fischer gave his understanding of the Council's wishes. Ms. Bollenback explained that staff was thinking of using MPO subcommittees to disseminate information and give input, not the formal MPO board itself. After additional dialogue, the motion CARRIED 5-2, with Chair Bruno and Council Members Alexander, Hayman, Persis and Wagner in support and Council Members Northey and Kelly in opposition.

Council Member Persis then moved to ADOPT the streetside amenities program with the exception of references to the benches, shelters and advertising. Council Member Hayman seconded the motion. After some discussion, the motion CARRIED 7-0.

Summary/Highlights:

This agenda item summarizes options for county council consideration and direction to move forward with the passenger amenities (bus benches) program in the unincorporated area.

Background:

In late 2009, the county was in the process of soliciting proposals from companies interested in providing benches with advertising at Votran bus stops in unincorporated Volusia County. The solicitation process was not completed due to the fact the state was working to standardize guidelines for ADA accessibility at bus stops.

Although the contract with Waverly Media, the bus bench provider at the time, was ended, Waverly has been allowed to continue to provide benches with advertising at 115 stops in unincorporated Volusia until the bus stops can be made compliant with new ADA rules and a new bench provider contract is in place.

To undertake the ADA improvements, each bus stop needs to be analyzed taking into consideration such things as available right of way, roadway configuration, proximity to the bus stopping point, and location of connecting sidewalks. ADA compliance varies depending on the characteristics of the stop. Engineering site work and pad design are underway and must

be completed before ADA-compliant bus pads can be installed. The process to complete the pad installation could take six months or more and cost an estimated \$218,000 (federal funds). Meanwhile, the county can undertake the process of establishing a new bench provider contract.

Votran is seeking county council direction on whether to continue with the status quo until a new bench advertising vendor contract is in place or to end the county's relationship with Waverly as soon as feasible. If Waverly is directed to remove its benches, Votran would have to purchase new benches at an estimated cost of \$92,000 (federal funds). In addition, Votran would be responsible for the installation and maintenance of the benches. Once a new bench advertising vendor is selected, Votran possibly could sell the benches to the vendor. Or it is possible the county could issue a contract for ad sales only, with the county owning and maintaining the benches and surrounding pads. Although this option is likely to earn Votran a higher commission on ad sales, there would be an annual maintenance cost of approximately \$65,000 that would not qualify for federal funding. This would include the salary and benefits of two fulltime service employees, and maintenance and fuel for a route service vehicle. There would be a one-time capital expense of \$70,000 (federal funds) to purchase a service vehicle.

Another option would be to end the relationship with Waverly and direct the benches be removed with no benches being placed in the future. This would erode customer service and would present a hardship for some passengers. Bus benches are not required.

Summary of options:

- -- Status quo with Waverly; pads are made ADA compliant; a new vendor contract is in place for a company to own and maintain benches supported with advertising revenue. Outside estimate of time, nine months to one year.
- -- End relationship with Waverly as soon as possible; benches are removed (outside estimate of time, two months); county purchase benches (outside estimate of time four months); pads are made ADA compliant; a new vendor contract is in place (explore option of selling benches to the chosen vendor, or selecting a vendor only to sell advertising with the county continuing to be responsible for benches). Outside estimate of time, nine months to a year.
- -- Eliminate benches altogether.

Votran's preference would be for the vendor to own, install and maintain benches and pads with a percentage of the advertising sales shared with Votran.



June 4, 2009 – Lois Bollenback presents a proposed Votran passenger amenities program where Votran would provide benches and shelters at Votran bus stops and no longer contract for advertising on bus benches throughout unincorporated Volusia County.

Council voted not to approve the proposed passenger amenities program for Votran to install & maintain benches (2-5 vote against)

Council did want benches with advertising in unincorporated areas but current County ordinance did not allow bus bench advertising in unincorporated areas.

Chair Bruno said if the county was going to continue to have bench advertising that there would need to be a change in the sign ordinance that would allow bus bench advertising. There was a motion and a second. At that time Ken Fischer gave his understanding of the council's wishes. Council approved (5-2) that the ordinance should be changed. After the ordinance change the procurement process for selection of an advertising firm would be revisited.

August 2009 - The sign ordinance was changed by Council to allow bus bench advertising in the unincorporated county.

The Council did not give clear direction in June 2009 to remove benches or to leave benches or to continue or cancel the contract with Waverly. To the best of Ken Fischer's recollection the decision was made at that time to have Waverly hold off on removing benches until ordinance was changed so that we would not be in a situation where we did not have any passenger amenities for our customers.

Votran did not anticipate the ADA accessibility issues that came about at the same time. Additionally, Votran did not expect that it would take this long for the RFP to go out and for a vendor to be selected. The issue should have been revisited when the additional delay began to discuss next steps and desire of the Council. This did not happen.

ADA accessibility issues came up and about this same time and we were waiting on final guidance from Tindale Oliver so that the report document could be included with the RFP document. This took much longer than anyone expected it would.





FBI seizes Daytona Beach-area company's docs in mortgage fraud case

Waverly Media at center of FBI investigation

UPDATED 5:21 PM EST Jan 31, 2013

PORT ORANGE, Fla. -

Federal agents were seen carrying boxes out of a Port Orange business Thursday morning after a three-year investigation into mortgage fraud.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, along with several local agencies, believes it will find information that connects Waverly Media, a bus-stop bench advertising firm, and its employees to a \$50 million mortgage scheme.

Investigators did not immediately take anyone into custody, but they said the documents may prove several people involved in the business defrauded banks into giving them mortgages.

WESH 2 News is not naming anyone involved in the investigation because no one was arrested Thursday morning.

Agents said the victims in this case are not only the defrauded banks but taxpayers as well, because these type of schemes helped lead to the economic downfall that prompted big bailouts.

Waverly Media is in the outdoor advertising business, but federal agents said operators consolidated other businesses, including a property business and title company.

Investigators said they believe the evidence will implicate the business in falsifying information about buyers who would otherwise be unqualified for a mortgage to obtain pricey ocean and riverfront homes.

The FBI has been investigating Waverly for three years, and Thursday's raid was the first public action.

Employees from other businesses in the industrial area on Dairy Circle were stunned as a swarm of agents, officers from Daytona Beach Shores with the mortgage fraud task force, and those with the division of financial services descended on the business.

"Actually I thought my boss was lying to me when he came in and said everybody was out here," said Kelly Roberts. "I had no idea."

The FBI investigation remains ongoing. Investigators said it may be weeks before anyone is charged.

Lois Bollenback, the former General Manager of Votran, gave the staff report. It included an overhead PowerPoint slide presentation. Council discussion followed. Concerns were expressed about losing revenue from bus bench advertising. Ms. Bollenback said during the previous year, only a little more than \$1,000 had come in from that revenue stream. She explained various issues with the bench advertising program in the unincorporated areas of the County. Many of the cities had turned toward setting their own bench advertising policies, where in the past they traditionally had not had any at all. She further explained about the cost to transition the program to one of non-advertising. She concluded by stating it was staff's desire that the Council give direction on the public transit amenities program in general and also on advertising on bus benches within the unincorporated County.

Public participation followed. Ramara Garrett, with Waverly Media, the only current, private bench provider in the County, distributed and spoke about a report on her firm's points of objection to the streetside amenities program. She felt there should be some way for the County to partner with her firm for the public's benefit. **Douglas Kosarek**, representing the Volusia Tax Reform Executive Committee, also was opposed to the program. He encouraged the Council to leverage its money and deny or alter the proposal.

Additional Council discussion ensued. Concerns were stated about spending County revenue when advertising companies already were paying for the use of the benches as a marketing tool. County Attorney Dan Eckert pointed out either the County's longstanding bench advertising policy needed to be in compliance with its own Zoning Ordinance or else the Ordinance had to be reworked so the County could follow its own regulations. County Manager Jim Dinneen suggested ideas for enabling the system to grow by answering the needs of its users. Concerns were made about the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) being included in the process.

More discussion followed. Concerns were expressed over losing the federal funding if it were not used right away. Ms. Bollenback and Ken Fischer, Interim General Manager of Votran, explained there were some time constraints, but the County would be safe from that for more than a year. Other discussion followed about various amenities and ways to develop them in different areas.

Council Member Northey said she felt the proposal was an opportunity to improve the community, develop a positive image and facilitate access for seniors and the disabled. She moved for APPROVAL of the program. Council Member Alexander seconded the motion. Some discussion on the motion followed. Chair Bruno called for an electronic vote and the motion FAILED 2-5, with

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Council Members Northey and Alexander in support and Council Members Hayman, Kelly, Persis, Wagner and Chair Bruno in opposition.

Chair Bruno said if the County was going to continue to have bench advertising, there would have to be a change in the sign ordinance. He said he would like a motion to direct staff to return to the Council with a change in the sign ordinance that would allow bus bench advertising. Mr. Eckert CLARIFIED the motion to be an amendment to the sign ordinance to allow the advertising and thereafter a revisiting of the procurement process for selection of an advertising firm.

Council Member Hayman so moved and Council Member Wagner seconded the motion. Further discussion ensued. Mr. Fischer gave his understanding of the Council's wishes. Ms. Bollenback explained that staff was thinking of using MPO subcommittees to disseminate information and give input, not the formal MPO board itself. After additional dialogue, the motion CARRIED 5-2, with Chair Bruno and Council Members Alexander, Hayman, Persis and Wagner in support and Council Members Northey and Kelly in opposition.

Council Member Persis then moved to ADOPT the streetside amenities program with the exception of references to the benches, shelters and advertising. Council Member Hayman seconded the motion. After some discussion, the motion CARRIED 7-0.

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Stacey Manning, Assistant County Attorney, explained how brokers would be obtained through the RSQ process. He said there was no statutory limitation regarding the amount of the commission and staff expected to select one broker for each side of the County. It was felt fewer brokers could focus their efforts on several properties better than many brokers with just one or two properties. Less training would be needed for the two brokers. Community Services Director Dave Byron explained the marketing strategies. Mr. Jasper and Housing and Grants Administration Manager Diana Phillips gave information about the demolition and redevelopment program as it pertained to blighted homes. Stimulus Grant Specialist Dona DeMarsh spoke about the possibility of a certain part of Energy and Environmental Block Grant (EEBG) funds being set aside for "greening" in rehabilitation efforts.

Public participation took place. **Nicole Tesnow** said she was concerned about the use of old data, transparency and reputable community partners. **Elizabeth Layton** wondered about accountability and the benefit to taxpayers in general.

Further discussion ensued. In response to a question from Council Member Hayman regarding the reliability of information on eligible facilities in given areas, County Attorney Dan Eckert stated the County's program followed the Federal guidelines that had been established when the bill creating the NSP was signed in 2008. He did not think there would be an individual cause of action.

Council Member Hayman moved for APPROVAL as recommended. Council Member Alexander seconded the motion. Discussion on the motion followed. Council Member Northey felt the requirement of "green rehabilitation" on every project should be added to the motion. Chair Bruno stated the issue was separate from the resolution to be voted on. He felt there would be no problem with obtaining support of it, but it should be addressed later. Council Member Northey said she would do so.

The motion CARRIED 7-0. Resolution No. 2009-81, entitled as follows and on file in its entirety with the records of the Volusia County Council, was duly ADOPTED.
