## **SALVATION ARMY VETERAN SSVF PROGRAM**

The Salvation Army has a new program for homeless Veterans or Veterans at risk of homelessness, the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program.

For those who are homeless, it can provide assistance to help them transition more quickly into permanent housing.

For those who are housed but at risk, it helps to maintain them in permanent housing. Assistance includes:

- Utility Assistance- monthly bills including deposits or late fees
- Rental Assistance- monthly payment including deposits or late fees
- Assistance in finding and obtaining housing locations
- Clothing
- Food
- Furniture
- Monthly bus passes

Veteran must have:

- Current State issued picture I.D. for self
- Copy of DD214
- If HUD-VASH, copy of HAP Plan
- Proof of monthly household income
- If food assistance, proof of address
- If clothing assistance, social security numbers of all in household and verification date of birth for any children
- For rental assistance, copy of lease agreement and eviction or deposit notice
- For utility assistance, original overdue bills or deposit notice
- For furniture assistance, copy of lease agreement
- For transportation, employment or educational verification for monthly bus passes
