WEST SIDE TOUR



Experience an impressive display of cut foliage greenery grown on the Puckett farm in Volusia County. Their products are shipped throughout the United States, Canada, Europe and Asia. See holiday wreaths, garlands, and specialty holiday items being constructed using the beautiful Southern Christmas greenery grown in Florida. From Hwy. 17, turn west on S.R. 40, go 4.0 miles, turn right on Stone Road to 1860, in Barberville. http://www.puckettfern.com

Come visit a small commercial farm with organic practices and see heirloom vegetables being grown from seed to harvest. Learn about the beneficial and practical use of composting, green manure, cover crops, drip irrigation and frost protection. From Hwy. 17, head west on Rte. 40 for one half mile, turn left onto Lemmon Rd. then right into the first driveway at 299. http://paulinesluckymarketgarden.blogspot.com/

C. VO-LaSALLE FARMS11:30 – 12:30

The Crump family, owners of Vo-LaSalle Farms, an active citrus operation, will discuss the latest citrus varieties, hydroponic strawberries and cutting edge irrigation techniques. Fresh picked fruit and vegables will be available for sale. Go south on Lake Winona Rd. 3.5 miles, left onto Johnson Lake Rd. Off U.S. 17, go east on Lake Winona Rd., turn right on Johnson Lake Road, and go to 601. http://www.giftfruitfromflorida.com/

D. FLORIDA OLIVE SYSTEMS......1:00 – 2:00

The Ford/Veech family of Volusia County has planted a 20-acre high density olive grove (11,160 trees) in DeLeon Springs. This experimental planting is to determine whether the success of mechanized olive farming is possible in Central Florida. The trees are grown to produce olives that can be used primarily for oil, but can also be used as table olives. There are other uses for olive trees, which many are beneficial to people's health and well-being: Olive leaf tea, olive leaf extract, cut foliage uses, landscape uses, and many different and ornate uses from the wood are just a few of the popular uses. Take Johnson Lake Rd. to Spring Garden Ranch Rd. Follow it around to 1599. (Entrance is 300 feet west of Reynolds Rd.) http://www.floridaolivesystems.com

E. EFG ORICHIDS2:30 – 3:30

J. GREEN FLAMINGO ORGANICS......3:00 – 4:00


