For lots located within:

- Unincorporated Volusia County
- Note: Stand-alone tree permits will not be issued within the Class II overlay zone

Information on Stand-Alone application:

- Section (02) Fill out completely, including street name and number (if unknown, get that information from Mapping Division first)
- Section (03) Check Stand-Alone Tree Clearing
- Section (05) Fill out, if applicable
- Signature(s)
 - o Owner must sign application, unless submitted by a licensed building contractor
 - o If owner's name is not shown in Property Appraiser system and/or if property has transferred within the last six (6) months, applicant must provide a copy of the recorded warranty deed
 - o Agent/contractor is not required to be licensed
 - o Signature(s) must be notarized
- Section (11) [on back of application] Fill in lot size and dimensions

<u>Information with application</u>:

- See back of application for complete list of required submissions
- Boundary survey
 - o No more than five (5) years old
 - o Is not required to be signed and sealed
 - o Any copies must be to scale
- Site plan to scale showing zoning setbacks, areas to be cleared, and location of tree barricades to be installed on site
- Application fee of \$76.00
- Corporate business check, cashier's check, or money order payable to County of Volusia

- Property Locator Placard should be posted on site as soon as possible
- Applicant is responsible for marking lot corners, and ensuring that corner markers are intervisible, before the initial tree inspection can be performed
- Tree barricades must be installed around the drip lines of all trees to be protected on site and must be inspected and approved by Environmental Permitting staff before a permit will be issued
- Tree permits will be issued in the office (in the field by request only)
