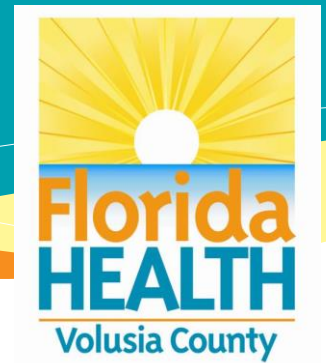

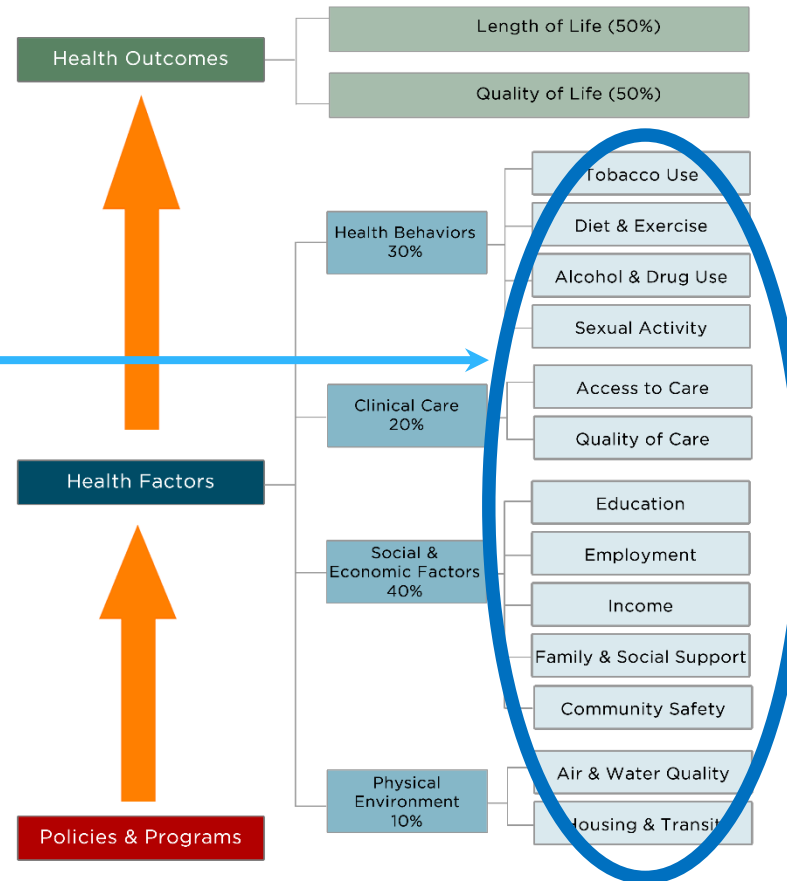

- * Increase/decrease in ranking is in comparison to other Florida counties

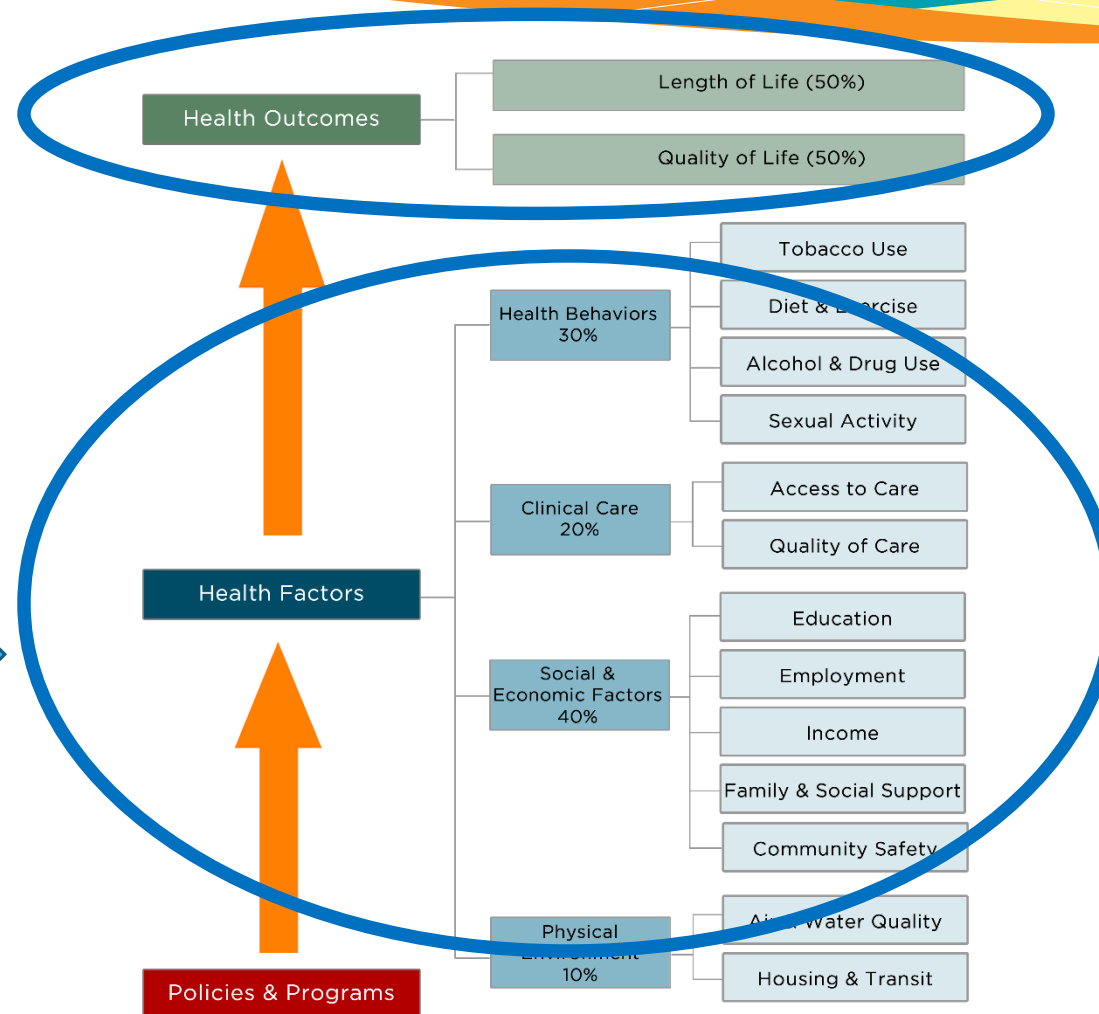


County Health Ranking Model © 2014 UWPHI

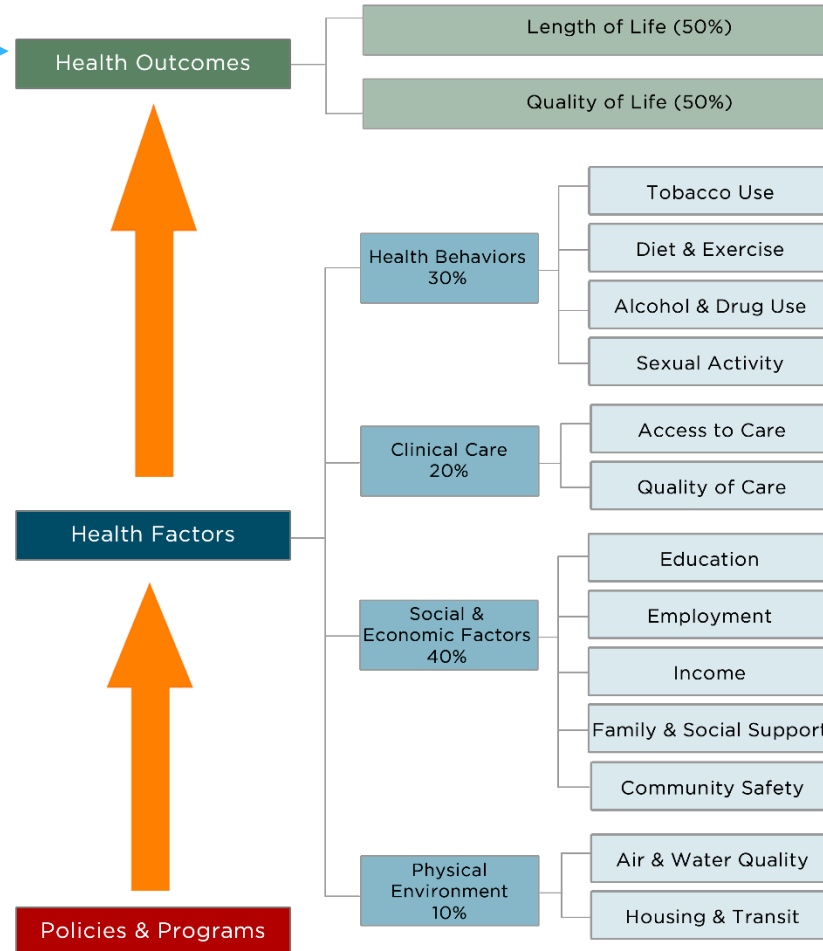

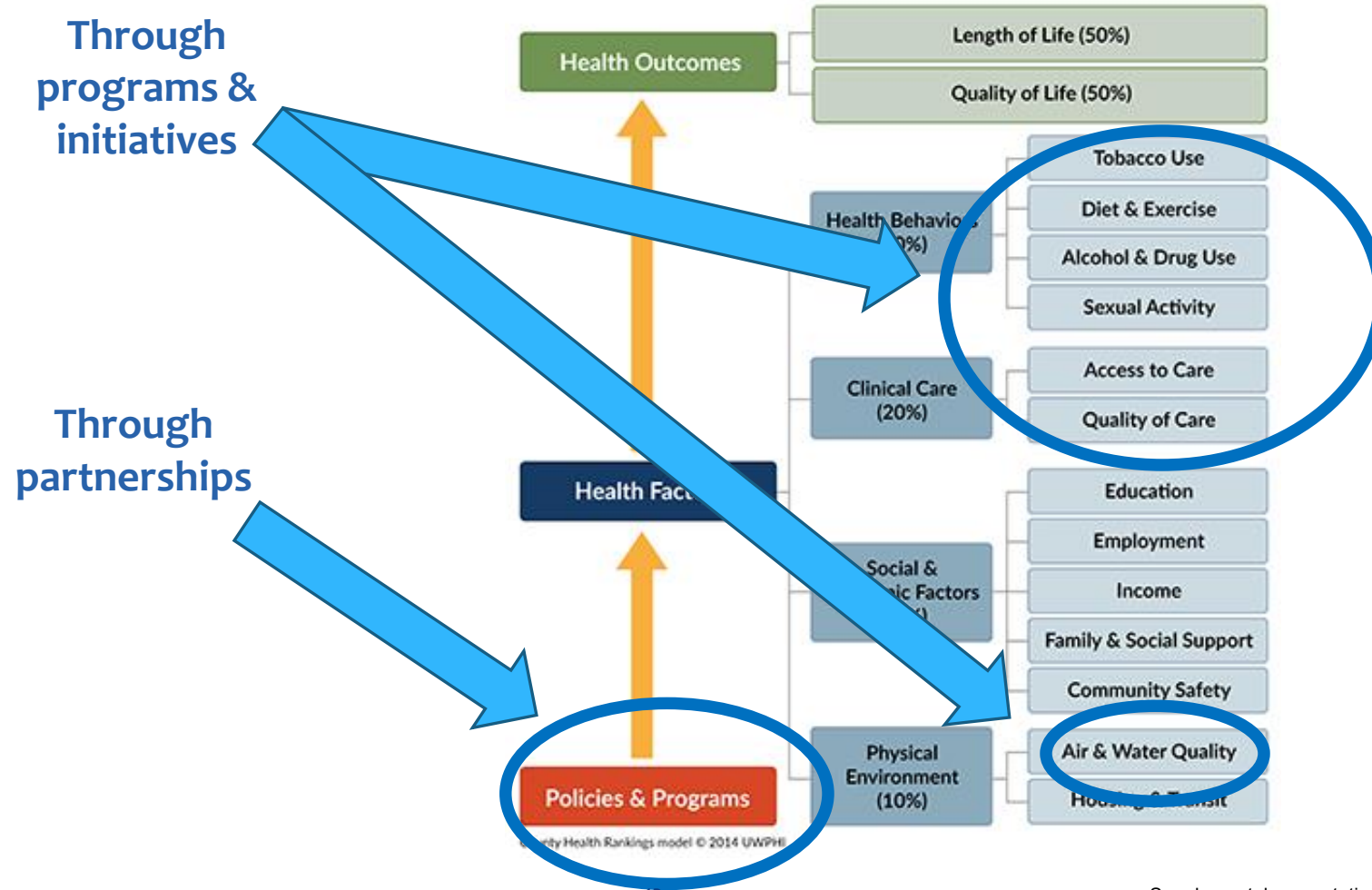

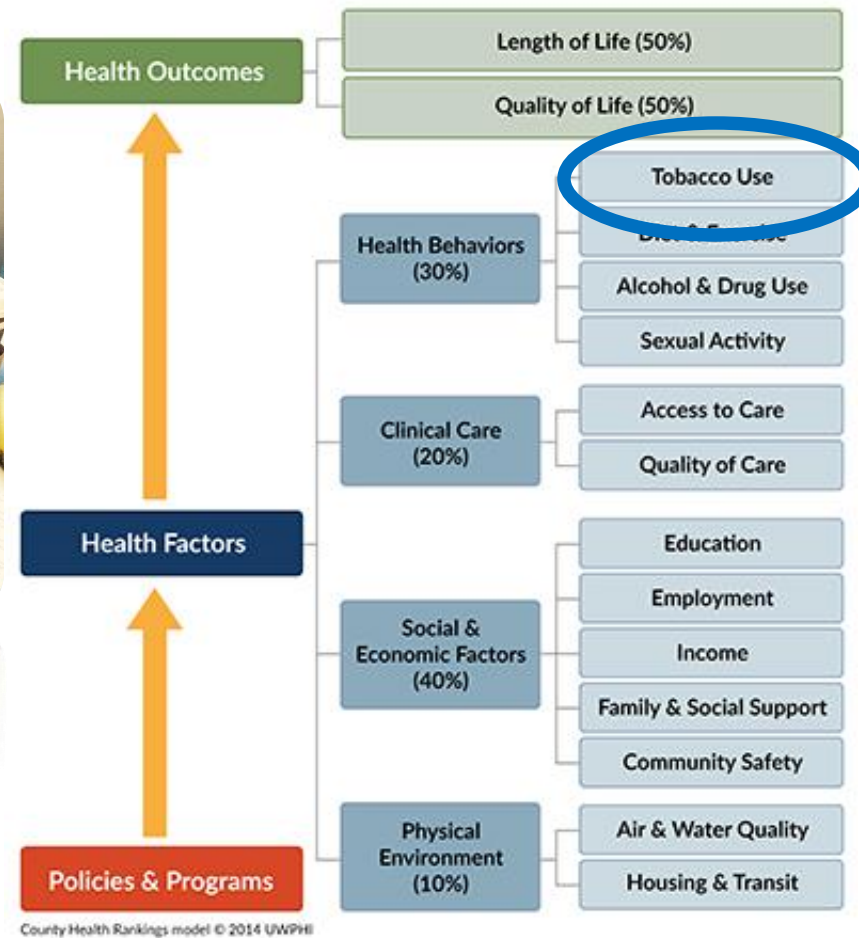

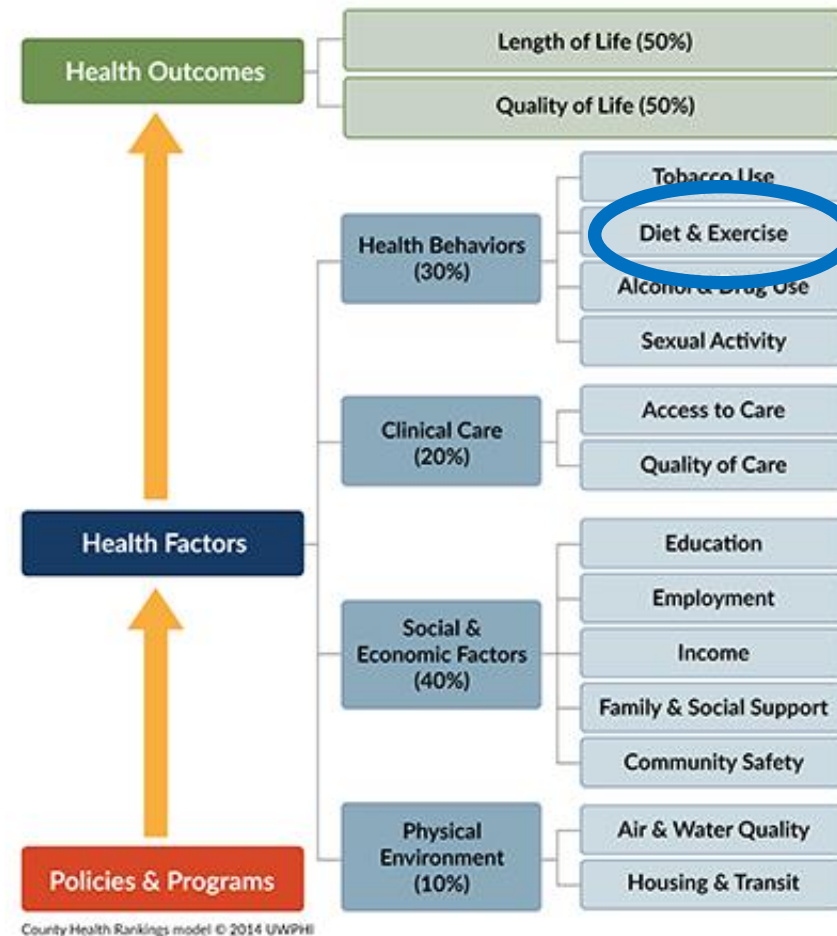

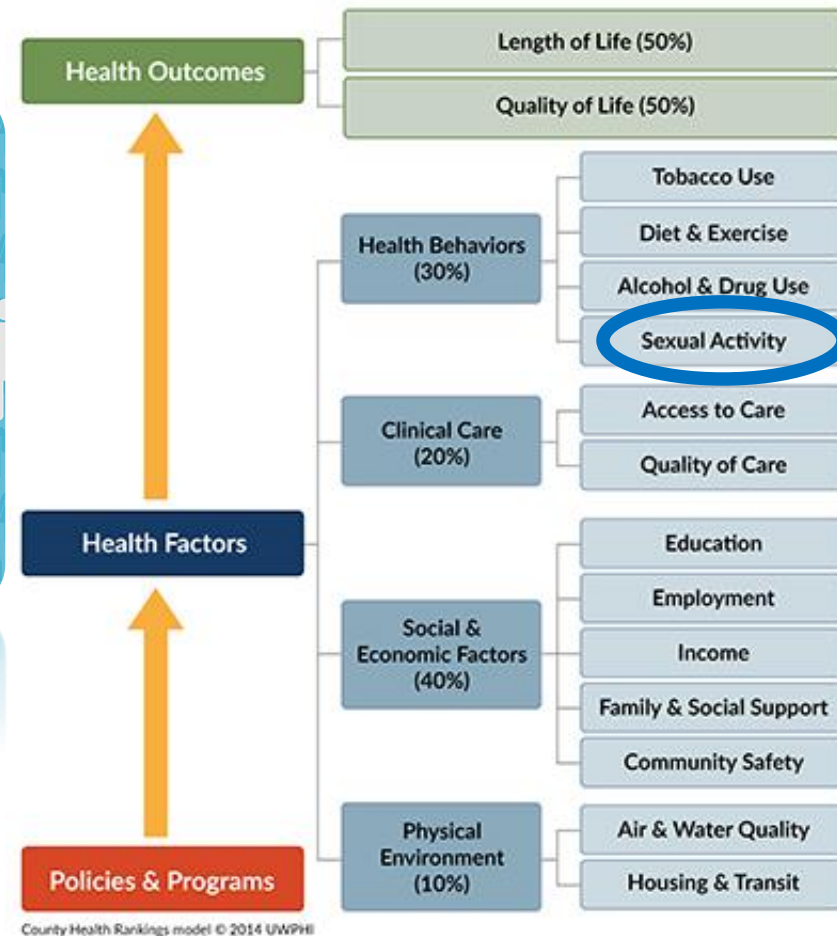
Tobacco Cessation Programs

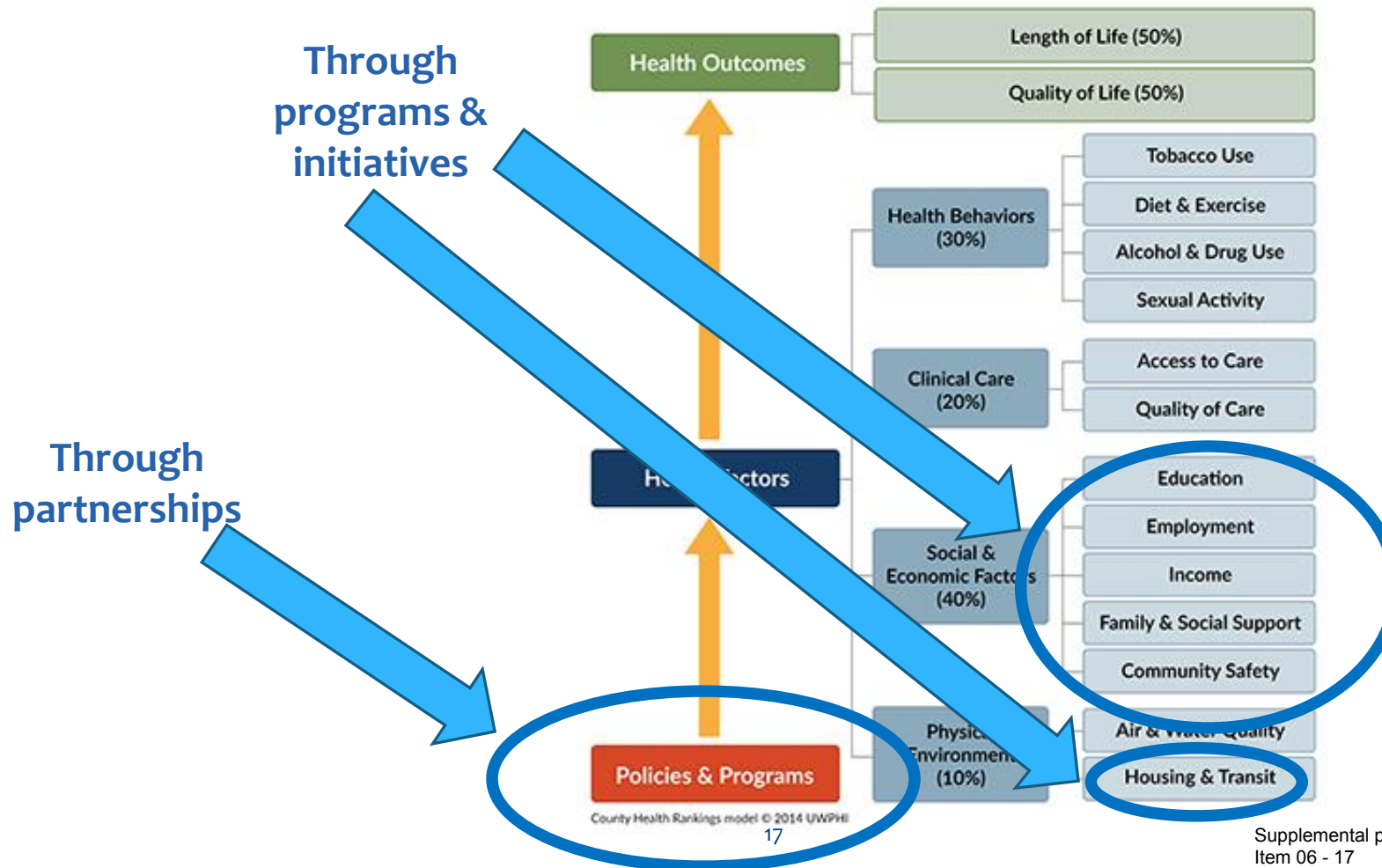

County Government's Role in Health



County Initiatives

- * **Client Emergency Services**

- * FY 2016/2017 Expenditures \$1,483,865
 - * 16,784 Individuals and/or households have been assisted

- * **Homeowner Housing Programs**

- * FY 2016/2017 Expenditures \$2,817,486
 - * 42 first time homebuyers assisted
 - * 39 owner-occupied homes rehabilitated
 - * 3 new homes constructed
 - * 3 Foreclosed homes acquired/rehabbed/resold
 - * 184 homeowners impacted by damage from Hurricane Matthew assisted

County Initiatives

- * **Rental Housing Program**

- * FY 2016/2017 Expenditures \$2,799,101
 - * 2 Single family units were created/rehabilitated
 - * 329 households received rental subsidies
 - * Minimum of 145 individuals have received bed nights

- * **Votran**

- * FY 2016/2017
 - * Average Rider had an annual income at or below \$10,000
 - * 3,248,466 Fixed Route Passengers
 - * 281,340 Gold Paratransit Passengers

Poverty

- * The majority of these health indicators are directly impacted by poverty
- * Health, housing, education, and transportation are areas that suffer when folks are in or facing poverty
- * County government continues to serve as a safety net as we provide services and facilitate, coordinate and partner with others to provide services

VCAN 2020

- * VCAN 2020 is a new initiative started by Food Brings Hope
- * Currently children (request assistance) that participate in Food Brings Hope programs, Kids Zone and Teen Zone, receive bags of food for their family to last the weekend. This is done in partnership with HUM and occurs during the school year
- * The goal of VCAN2020 is to be the first county in the country to eliminate youth (ages 0-24) hunger and homelessness
- * Will be able to provide services if requested

New county pilot

- * County staff (Community Assistance, Parks, Recreation and Culture, and Library Services) has begun coordinating with Halifax Urban Ministries on developing a pilot program to deliver backpacks of food to youth at several of our summer food and summer camp sites
- * The backpack would provide enough food for a family to last the weekend

VCAN2020

- * The hope of the pilot program is to determine viability of expanding the program to more students throughout the school year
