WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS

Roundtable Vice Chair Lois Paritsky welcomed those in attendance and, following introductions of the attendees, led all in the Pledge of Allegiance.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

John Booker, Government Affairs Liaison, Volusia County, provided an overview of the bills that went before the State Legislature during the 2024 session. Mr. Booker stated this year's session was adjourned in the early evening on Friday, March 8.

Discussion and questions ensued.

VoRIDE PROGRAM

Bobbie King, Transit Services Division Director, Volusia County, provided an overview of the operations and how individuals may utilize the VoRide program. Ms. King explained the routes and fees associated with this service. She stated mobility on demand combines traditional public transportation with private enterprises. Ms. King announced phase two of the program is scheduled to be implemented on April 8, 2024.

SUMMER FOOD AND SUMMER CAMP PROGRAMS 2024

Carmen Hall, Community Assistance Division Director, Volusia County, reviewed the Summer Food and Summer Camp programs. The Summer Food Program will operate from June 3 through August 9, 2024. Ms. Hall explained the funding for the programs and how an organization could apply to become a summer food site. Ms. Hall provided the information on summer camp scholarships and the eligibility. She also provided information on a new program called Volusia Cares. She explained

Volusia Cares is a resource individual seeking social services can utilize, and library staff assists with keeping the information up to date.

Vernon Burton, Mayor, City of Lake Helen, commented on the VLOC meeting held in January 2024 in Lake Helen and how successful it was. He thanked everyone who participated in the event.

Fred Cleveland, Mayor, New Smyrna Beach, stated spring break 2024 has begun and the City of New Smyrna Beach Police Department, in conjunction with the Volusia County Sheriff's Office, is prepared for the additional visitors and events to the area. He wished everyone a safe spring break.

Don Burnette, Mayor, City of Port Orange, commented on HB 1365 addressing unauthorized public camping and public sleeping. He stated this bill adds challenges to communities in remaining compliant with the Pottinger Agreement. Mayor Burnette also requested discussion at a future meeting regarding the scheduling of Roundtable meetings. He asked that the committee consider making them guarterly.

Lois Paritsky, Mayor, Town of Ponce Inlet, thanked the presenters and stated their presentations were very informative.

Sammuel Bennett, Mayor, Town of Pierson, provided accolades to staff for coordinating the meeting. He also gave accolades to Volusia County Transit Services for their work and stated the VoRide program is an asset to the community.
