FINANCE

Information Technology: Completed a major upgrade to the SACS software used to manage the Section-8 program for Human Services. This upgrade, which involved the migration of eleven databases, not only provides better integration with the County's financial system, but also improves security. The new module allows landlords to log in and verify that checks have been issued by the County for Section-8 recipients. Staff also initiated the development of a web-based GIS portal designed to make the County's geographic data sets available to a wider audience. This portal provides tools for viewing GIS data without incurring the licensing costs of ArcGIS Online or Desktop software. These tools include integrated business intelligence and reporting software and will allow real-time collaboration between divisions and municipal partners. Staff predicts that the site will have 200 registered users by the end of the year, many of whom would not have access to GIS data otherwise. OCEAN CENTER
