## **COMMUNITY SERVICES**

**Environmental Management:** On April 9, the MSC hosted the 18th annual Turtle Day event. The event featured educational programs, environmental vendors, and activities for kids, music, food, and the release of three green sea turtles. Over 3,900 people visited the center for the event and over 1,000 attended the sea turtle release. Donations were collected at the event entrance and \$582 was raised to support the MSC. Water quality staff performed routine sampling on the Indian River Lagoon as well as three of its tributaries - Turnbull Creek, Edgewater Canal, and Gabordy Canal. *Events:* On April 20, Volusia County Schools will host their Spring Instructional Job Fair in the ballroom with 300 attendees expected.
