Information Technology: The County went live with the Corrections' new Jail Management System. This is a significant milestone in an ongoing multi-year overhaul of Criminal Justice Information Systems. Staff assisted the Supervisor of Elections with redrawing precinct boundaries and updating the Voter Registration application. Staff rolled out a new online dashboard for tracking sea turtle nesting activity on the County's beaches. Staff made improvements to the Volusia Beaches mobile app, including updated information about turtle nests and lifeguard stations, and developed a new online application form for Human Services, to assist landlords needing to apply for assistance from the County.
