COMMUNITY SERVICES

Community Assistance: Community Assistance is accepting applications from non-profit organizations to implement homelessness prevention or rapid rehousing programs. There is \$145,833 in Emergency Solutions Grant funding available for these programs. Up to 7.5 percent of the funds can be used for program administration. The funding requires awarded agencies to provide a 100 percent match. Homelessness prevention programs provide housing relocation and stabilization services for individuals or families who are at imminent risk of becoming homeless. Rapid rehousing programs provide housing relocation and stabilization services to help individuals or families living in shelters or in places not meant for human habitation to move into permanent housing and achieve stability. Programs must serve the entire county. Applications will be accepted through Aug. 9 online at https://uwvfc.communityforce.com/Funds/Search.aspx. Community Information: Staff promoted the upcoming Palm Bluff Conservation Corridor ribbon cutting with a news release and social media posts and is working with Resource Stewardship and the St. Johns River Water Management District to coordinate the event. Mosquito Control: Surveillance data shows an increase in biting midges or "no-see-ums" along the coastal communities in the district. These insects are most active during dusk and dawn. Mosquito Control does not conduct treatment operations for biting midges. We recommend using an EPA approved repellent labeled for no-see-ums. "Vision Zero" and the new federal infrastructure bill are a major focus of the conference. "Vision Zero's" goal is to eliminate fatal and serious injury crashes.
