**Road & Bridge:** The pre-construction meeting for the Gabordy Canal Stormwater Treatment Facility at 10<sup>th</sup> Street project was held on June 15, and notice to proceed with construction has been issued to the contractor. Work will soon be underway for the water quality improvement project that entails the installation of a nutrient removal treatment facility for base flow and roadway stormwater runoff conveyed by the Gabordy Canal prior to its discharge into the Mosquito Lagoon. The project is funded in part through grants from the St. Johns River Water Management District and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.
