Administration: The second Affordable Housing Land Development Regulations committee meeting was held at the EOC on Feb. 16.

Environmental Management: Volusia County Schools have started reserving field trips to the Marine Science Center with five school groups booked for February and eight groups for March. Summer camp is already completely booked, and staff looks to build on last year's successful camps that focused its programs on the marine and terrestrial habitats around Ponce Inlet. Members of the Marine Mammal Stranding Team have been busy with multiple rescues and recoveries of sick or dead manatees. On Feb. 16, members of the Marine Mammal Stranding Team assisted Disney in releasing a rehabilitated manatee named "Plantaina" at Blue Springs State Park. Water Quality staff performed monthly routine sampling on the Indian River Lagoon. Clarity of the water was very good, which is typical for this time of year with lower temperatures and less rainfall occurring compared to summer months. Testing showed no indication of algae blooms.
