***Community Information***

Community Information staff are collaborating with members of the Volusia/Flagler Public Information Network (PIN) on the *Step Up Volusia: Wash Up. Back Up. Mask Up.* Campaign, which will begin on June 29. The purpose of the messaging of a new public awareness campaign is designed to help reinforce the continuing need for residents to practice hand-washing, social distancing and the wearing of face coverings. The campaign will include social media platforms, digital advertising and billboards urging people to follow the public health guidance. Celebrities, recognizable figures, local dignitaries and community influencers will be featured to help bolster the message that now isn't the time for the community to let its guard down. Local residents also will be encouraged to participate in the campaign to help share the message.

## **Public Works**

### ***Coastal***

The Coastal Division installed new beach ramp gates at the Emilia Street ramp in Daytona Beach Shores and collaborated with county Corrections on landscape improvements at Toronita Park in Wilbur-by-the-Sea. ### ***Mosquito Control***

Mosquito Control is distributing *Gambusia* (mosquito fish) to flooded areas holding water as a biological control of mosquito larvae. ### ***Traffic Engineering***

Staff continues to review a high number of traffic impact analysis despite recent impacts to the economy. In southeast DeLand (generally south of SR 44 and east of Boston Ave), county staff is currently reviewing several large residential projects including Beresford Residential, Park Lake Estates, and Reserve at Victoria. Approval of these projects, which are not part of Victoria Park, would result in 1,292 single family homes and 482 multifamily residential units.
