Environmental Management: Thanks to a \$47,160 grant from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, five derelict vessels were removed from the St. Johns River and its tributaries Nov. 2 -5. Volusia County Environmental Management contracted with TSI Disaster Recovery, LLC from Melbourne, Florida to conduct the removals. These vessels, totaling 17.43 tons, were destroyed and taken to the Tomoka Landfill for proper disposal, improving the environment of the St. Johns River.
