Environmental Management: On Nov. 19, members from the Volusia County Marine Mammal Stranding participated in a multi-agency training event. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Manatee Rescue Program conducted the training. Team members were trained in open water net set rescue techniques. A PowerPoint was given by Nadia Gorden (FWC NEFL), and then participants received hands on experience deploying the manatee rescue net, bringing the animal on board (a trashcan was used in place of a manatee) and then resetting the net. Planning & Development Services: On Dec. 1, the County had its triennial CRS Community Cycle Visit. The visit is an evaluation, which determines our program status and identifies needs for improvement. This is a voluntary incentive program recognizing community floodplain management practices that exceed the minimum requirements of the NFIP. The County currently has an excellent CRS Class 5, rating which offers a 25% discount on flood insurance premiums for citizens within unincorporated areas of the County. Staff are currently conducting granular characterization of our aerial larvicide system to verify swath and density of product applied. This information allows for more accurate planning of larvicide treatments to target immature mosquitoes in the water and prevent them from emerging into adults.
