Requirements

Applicants must be at least 16 years old on or before June 1, 2023, and be able to:

- Swim 500 meters freestyle in under 10 minutes
- · Swim 50 yards freestyle in under 30 seconds
- Run a half-mile in under 3 minutes, 15 seconds

Successful completion of the recruit class, background check, physical and drug screening are conditions for hire.



The first day of the recruit class will start at: Daytona State College's Aquatic Center. All other classes will be held at: Lifeguard Headquarters, 515 S. Atlantic Ave., Daytona Beach

Class 1: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday, June 5 - Saturday, June 10
