Registration is not required for this free workshop.

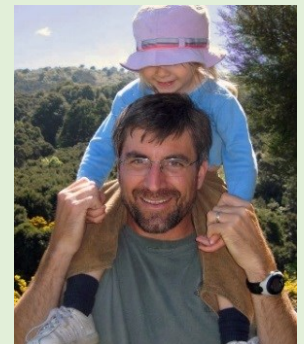
