



SHIP Disaster Recovery Program

The purpose of the SHIP Disaster Recovery Program is to assist eligible households whose homes have sustained damage from a disaster. The program is designed to provide either reimbursement or repayment of the homeowner's insurance deductible or home repair for homeowner's who have no homeowner insurance.

Community Assistance received 136 applications from homeowners who were in need of this program in 2016 due to Hurricane Matthew. Below is a breakdown of expenditures by county and city:

Funding sources:

- State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP)
 - Total funds allocated: \$914,253

Eligibility requirements:

- Home must:
 - Be located within County's service areas, not in the city limits of Daytona Beach or Deltona, cities which are eligible to receive grant funds directly
 - Have sustained damage from hurricane
- Applicants must:
 - Own the home
 - Not exceed the household income limits
 - Apply to FEMA
 - Apply to their homeowner's insurance (if applicable)

Maximum loan amount

- Not to exceed \$20,000
 - Funds are provided as a grant (no security instrument)
