

## FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for Volusia County's Plaza Boulevard Ramp repairs due to damages from Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW-06977). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Floodplain:** Project is located in the VE Zone, otherwise known as the Coastal High Hazard Area, or areas subject to inundation by the 1-percent-annual-chance flood event with additional hazards due to storm-induced velocity wave action, per Volusia County FIRM Panel #12127C0219J dated 3/16/2015.
- Proposed Work and Purpose:** Volusia County will replace a vehicle pad and ramp at the Plaza Boulevard beach access road, employing hazard mitigation techniques including the addition of a bulkhead wall, a stormwater management system, and structural fill to protect the facility from similar events in the future.
- Project Alternatives:** FEMA has considered the no action alternative and has determined that it is not feasible to take no action as the facility provides access to waters for recreational use and leaving it unrepaired would potentially have adverse sociological, economic, and human safety impacts. Alternative locations were not considered as the beach access road is functionally dependent upon its location in the floodplain.
- Comments:** This will serve as the final public notice regarding the above-described action funded by the FEMA PA program.
