

## PROJECT ADVISORY COMMITTEE (PAC) Meeting #7 Summary

**DATE:** November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2013

**RE:** Tom Staed Veterans Memorial Bridge: Bridge Pier Styles

**Discussion:**

- The next Subcommittee meeting will be on Monday November 18<sup>th</sup> from 3:30 to 4:30 at the Daytona Regional Chamber of Commerce. The Subcommittee will be taking a field trip to the memorial plaza proposed location at the end of their meeting.
- Two motions discussed at the past subcommittee meeting. One, the WWII memorial in Tusawilla Park to be relocated to the veterans' plaza. Two, remove all the parking and use a portion of the courthouse parking lot and add appropriate signing. All PAC agreed to both.
- The goal is to vote on which bridge pier everyone likes and which light poles are preferred.
- The budget is being reduced based on funding source conditions. We need to continue to be very cost conscious and look for opportunities for savings.
- There are 5 bridge pier options:
  - Option 1: Coquina textured bottom, inset panels, rectangular overlook. Construction cost would be around \$2.27 million.
  - Option 2: Coquina textured bottom, inset panels, circular overlook. Construction cost would be about \$2.27 million.
  - Option 3: Full coquina texture, inset panels, rectangular overlook. Construction cost would be about \$2.62 million.
  - Option 4: Coquina textured base, pointed piers, triangular overlook. Construction cost would be about \$3.14 million.
  - Option 5: Full coquina texture, inset panels, triangular overlook. Construction cost would be about \$3.61 million.
- There will be an overlook on every pier. There will be 10 piers on each side, so a total of 20 piers. The piers will be spaced approximately every 144 ft. The sidewalks are 8ft wide and the overlooks are 4ft x 12ft in area.
- The committee voted to have rectangular bridge piers with rectangular overlooks and to have the coquina only at the base of the piers.
- The Design Team will look into having charging stations for electric wheelchairs.
- The budget of this project is presently around \$33 million dollars now.
- The committee selected the Serenade light fixtures, with the possible inclusion of an arm that would locate the light closer to the travel lanes. The Serenade is a new low power LED light fixture that offers superior light distribution, and also provides lower maintenance and life cycle costs. Engineer's estimate of probable costs is around \$1,535,000 dollars.
- New project on Orange Ave, from Nova Road to Beach Street. It is all going to be reconstructed (road, sidewalks, curbs). Looking into extending that project to connect to ours and then extending our project all the way down to A1A.

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- ***Public Comments:***
- Have Braille located somewhere on the memorials. Keep it green and cost effective. Make sure to have charging stations on the bridge.
