1846 - 1848



After the annexation of Texas in 1845, the US and Mexico failed to resolve a boundary dispute leading to the declaration of war on May 13th, 1846. The war ended with the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, giving the U.S. control of Texas, and the greater Southwestern United States.

Civil War 1861 - 1865



Fought by the Northern Union Army against seven Southern states which formed the Confederate States of America. Spanish-American War



1898 - 1902



On April 25, 1898, the United States declared war with Spain following the Cuban War of Independence and the sinking of the USS Maine in the harbor at Havana. The result was the 1898 Treaty of Paris which allowed temporary control of Cuba, and ceded colonial authority over Puerto Rico, Guam and the Philippine islands.

World War I 1917 - 1918

By the end of the war in November of 1918, four major imperial powers ceased to exist, and the map of Europe was redrawn. European Theatre

Beginning with Germany's invasion of Poland, by June of 1940, Germany had taken control of a large portion of Western Europe, and was moving to invade the United Kingdom. Allied forces, led by the US and British forces, fought back with an extensive air and ground campaign, including the massive D-day invasion at Normandy Beach on June 6th 1944. European Theatre

The D-day Invasion on June 6th, 1944 put over 180,000 troops ashore in Normandy, creating a beachhead that would eventually result in over 3 million Allied soldiers on Germany's western front. Combined with the Eastern front battles with Russian forces, the Allied forces overwhelmed the German Army, forcing an unconditional surrender on May 8th, 1945, commonly known as VE Day.

1964 - 1975



After communist losses during the Tet Offensive, and increasing political pressures from home, in 1969, the U.S. began a gradual withdrawal of ground forces, with U.S. military involvement ending in the spring of 1975. The war ended after the fall of Saigon on April 30th 1975. Vietnam was reunified following the war as the Republic of Vietnam.
