

**TENTH EXTENSION OF DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY  
FOR HURRICANE NICOLE**

**WHEREAS**, on November 7, 2022, the Governor of the State of Florida issued Executive Order Number 22-253 declaring a state of emergency for Volusia County as a result of Hurricane Nicole which threatened life and property; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Chair pursuant to County ordinance acting on behalf of the Volusia County Council declared a local state of emergency effective November 7, 2022, which was extended for one additional 1-day duration on November 14, 2022, and eight additional 7-day durations on November 15, 22, and 29, and December 6, 13, 20, and 27, 2022, and January 3, 2023, for all territories within the legal boundaries of Volusia County, including the unincorporated and incorporated areas; and


**WHEREAS**, the residents of Volusia County continue to suffer from the aftermath of Hurricane Nicole and require emergency assistance and services; and

**WHEREAS**, section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, and section 46-143, Code of Ordinances, County of Volusia, provide that the county may declare a local state of emergency for a 7 day duration, which may be extended as necessary in 7 day increments, may waive procedures and formalities otherwise required of the county by law and ordinance, and may take whatever prudent action is necessary to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of the community.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that effective January 10, 2023, the County Chair on behalf of the Volusia County Council hereby extends the previously declared local state of emergency for all territory within the legal boundaries of Volusia County, including the unincorporated and incorporated areas, for a 7-day duration.
