Applications for items to be heard by the Historic Preservation Board (HPB) shall be submitted to the Growth and Resource Management Department, Planning & Development Services Division. Staff have three days from the date of submission to determine if the application is complete. If the application is determined to be incomplete and the applicant does not provide the corrected or additional information within three days after the deadline date, said application will not be considered "filed" for the purpose of processing for staff review or placed on the HPB agenda.

HPB hearings are held in the County Council Meeting Room of the Thomas C. Kelly Administration Center, 123 West Indiana Avenue, DeLand, commencing at 2:00 p.m.

Appeals of HISTORIC PRESERVATION BOARD Decisions

All Appeals under Section 62-45 must be submitted within 10 working days after rendition of the order, requirement, decision, or determination of the HPB by filing an application with the Volusia County Planning & Development Services Division. The application specifying the grounds for appeal, together with the application fee shall be filed with the zoning enforcement official and with the legal department.

The appeal will be scheduled before the County Council within sixty (60) days of receipt of an appeal application and fee, unless extended by stipulation of the historic preservation board and appellant. Failure to conduct the hearing within this time frame shall not invalidate the decision on appeal. Due public notice requirements must be met.

Any appeal of a decision by the historic preservation officer or the board shall be on evidence in the record.

No appeal shall be granted in whole or in part unless four (4) members of the County Council concur.
